Restore our Fortunes, O Lord - Psalm 126 Notes, Family Worship, Bible Reading

Notes from the Sermon

When was the last time you can say you felt and/or experienced joy?

Lots of things bring us that feeling. A puppy or kitten. Getting a new toy. Your wedding day. Getting your college diploma. Having a child. The (insert favorite sports team) winning the (insert championship)! Playing with your grandchildren (and then, sending them home!) Many things can be said to bring us joy, and those things are wonderful things!

What about joy in Christ? When was the last time your joy in Christ manifested in tears, or laughter, or shouting for joy? John Piper responded to a question from Susan about Joy, saying, "...Joy in God is not a choice. It is a God-given, spontaneous experience of the beauty, worth, greatness of God. But there are choices that we can make that may lead to that experience, because the Bible says, "Look. Look and pray. Look at the Lord in his word, and pray for eyes to see and a heart to feel."

My goal for you today is to look at Psalm 126 and do exactly what John Piper says, because that is what they did. They remembered where they were (likely captivity in Babylon), they remembered what God had done for them (rescued them and restored them from captivity), and they shouted for joy!

We should be experts at doing the same thing they did. We remember where we were (sinners, dying and lost, condemned), we remember what Jesus did for us (saved us from our sins), and we then remember what our response should be: Singing, praising, shouting, dancing, whatever it may be, in joy to the Lord for what He has done.

Simple application to this sermon, and for you to ponder at home: What are you doing, what are you remembering, to spark the flame of Joy in your soul? Today is a great day to Read Psalm 126, to pray Psalm 126, to sing Psalm 126 (I recommend the version by Charlie Hall, it's a throwback to early 1990's Passion Conferences), and to remember the word of Jesus in your life. Or, it could be, today is the day to trust in Jesus for the first time! That would also be a joyous occasion. Either way, seek the Lord today in Psalm 126, lift up His name, and remember, His will for you is to have Joy, and have it in abundance in Him!
